

19th Annual Conference on the Science of Dissemination and Implementation
December 13-16, 2026

Session Descriptions

Individual Oral Presentations: Individual oral presentations should be no longer than 15 minutes and can employ PowerPoint slides, if needed. 3-4 oral presentations on a common topic will be grouped together by the track review committee for a 75-minute session with adequate time for audience Q & A.

Panel Presentations: Panel presentations are comprised of 3-4 related papers plus an optional discussant. Approximately half of the 75-minute session time should be saved for questions and discussion of the presentations.

Note: The number of panels accepted will be limited. In general, we suggest submission as individual oral presentations unless you have a compelling integrated research story that requires multiple presentations in a single session, fits well with the overall conference theme, and addresses one or more of the topic categories listed above.

Poster Presentations: Posters are required to be printed and hung on the assigned poster board at the conference. There will be designated poster sessions grouped by track, to facilitate interaction with poster presenters. One poster board measuring 4 feet tall x 8 feet wide will be provided on-site for each poster presentation. All mounting supplies (e.g. push pins) will also be provided on-site.

Pre-Conference Workshops: Pre-Conference Workshops can be up to 3.5 hours long with as many as six speakers/facilitators per session. Workshops must be engaging, skills-based, and interactive to optimize learning and application of skills.

Stories of Impact Plenary Presentations: Story submissions should describe how D&I science led to measurable and sustained health and/or service delivery improvements, economic or payment reforms, or policy change. Selected presenters will be invited to share their story as part of a plenary panel session with moderated discussion.

Note: Stories will undergo a phased review process. Those that advance to Phase Two will be asked to provide a one-minute video within one week of notification, which will be considered as part of the final selection process.
